

Hagar wins again at Lexington 104

Champion, Sammy Swindell from Germantown, TN to the first turn and then held

the veteran sprint car racing legend off for 30 laps for the victory. The 2012 USCS National Champion, Tim Crawley from Benton, AR followed Swindell in the K&N Filters Podium Award third

place at the finish. Hernando, MS ace Brad Bowden finished fourth and Benton, Arkansas’ Cody Gardner brought the Roland #88R home in fifth place.
